

What: Idaho Chapter of the American College of Bankruptcy Presentation on Five Supreme Court Decisions Issued in its Last Term.

On June 23, 2011, the Supreme Court handed down a 5-4 decision in *Stern v. Marshall*, 131 S.Ct. 2594 (2011) holding that a bankruptcy court's exercise of statutory jurisdiction was unconstitutional when it adjudicated a counterclaim relating to a purely state law cause of action. Many believed at that time that further decisions from the U.S. Supreme Court would be necessary to clarify the jurisdictional holding in that case.

Over the past nine months a decision from the Supreme Court has helped to clarify at least some portions of the *Stern v. Marshall* decision. Also the U.S. Supreme Court has issued 4 other decisions involving other issues arising in bankruptcy cases.
